Course Description:

This course will focus on current research and best practices to address the needs of stroke patients with dysphagia. Discussion will focus on the screening of dysphagia, re-evaluation of the clinical swallowing evaluation with an emphasis on the cranial nerve examination, and advanced interpretation of the videofluoroscopic evaluation. Treatment issues will focus on behavioral management directed to specific physiologic impairment, updates on neuromuscular electrical stimulation, and neuroplastic effects of treatment. While this seminar is concentrated on stroke, practice patterns can be applied to other neurogenic populations.

Speaker: Stephanie K. Daniels

Stephanie K. Daniels is a research speech pathologist at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center and is on academic faculty at Baylor College of Medicine and University of Houston in Houston, TX. She has practiced as a speech pathologist focused on stroke for over 15 years. Dr. Daniels has published numerous peer-reviewed articles and is the co-author of Dysphagia Following Stroke.
